KDE is a graphical desktop environment aimed at both home and professional use. Under constant development since its founding in 1996, KDE has evolved into an integrated workplace with lots of applications working together, and regularly receives user awards. Since KDE is Open Source software, anyone interested can download its source code and have a look at how particular features are implemented. Due to KDE being Open Source software, KDE relies on the contribution of volunteers. Having the source code available, together with extensive documentation, allows developers to customize applications to specific situations without having to request licenses or wade through thousands of lines of source code.

The last version including major feature improvements, KDE 3.5, was released November 2005, while its second service release, KDE 3.5.2, has been released in March 2006. KDE has been translated into more than 60 languages and runs under a variety of Operating Systems, such as different versions of Linux, BSD, but also under traditional Unix variants. KDE has an extensive user base and is used by a multitude of large companies as the free desktop environment of their choice.

aKademy plays a central role in the yearly Free Software events agenda since it is there where cross-project collaboration and forming a common platform for the Linux desktop is taking place.

The KDE project expects more than 150 contributors to visit aKademy 2006 this September in Dublin, Ireland.

Developing KDE 4

This year's aKademy will focus on getting KDE 4 into shape.

KDE 4 is the next major release of KDE and will raise the bar for desktop developers by providing unique frameworks for the storage of personal information (Akonadi [<http://pim.kde.org/akonadi/>]), hardware abstraction (Solid [<http://solid.kde.org/>]), desktop interaction (Plasma [<http://www.plasma.org/>]), multimedia (Phonon [<http://phonon.kde.org/>]), and a wealth of other new and innovative technologies. A technology preview of KDE 4 is planned to be finished in October. At aKademy, the work on this preview will be the focus of most developers. KDE 4 will also show how much the KDE community has grown, even beyond the programming world: usability experts and marketing professionals have joined the collaborative effort of other non-coding contributors such as translators, documentation writers, and artwork specialists.
